

Philippine Center Update May 2012

The new Philippine Center finally opened its doors and had its first Free Medical Clinic at the Zablocki Park Pavilion at 3717 W Howard Avenue, Greenfield WI last March 10, 2012. Philippine Center Executive Director Gerry Ramos and Free

Medical Clinic Director Dr. Violeta Singson together with the Zablocki Park Manager Dan Roddy led the doctors, volunteers and patients in the blessing ceremony officiated by Fr. Jojo Orosa of St. Camillus.

55 uninsured and underinsured patients were served cookies and juice before being seen by the doctors. They were provided medical care and given free medication that morning.

This event at Zablocki Park Pavilion reinforced the partnership between the Philippine Cultural and Civic Center Foundation (PCCCF) and the Milwaukee County Parks (PARKS). Major improvements to the Zablocki Pavilion had been made by PCCCF. Energy efficient windows were installed. Electrical and HVAC systems have been updated. New air conditioning units will be installed. New carpets were installed, interior walls painted, existing floors dusted, mopped and cleaned. Furniture and equipment are now in place.

8800 SF Zablocki County Park Pavilion is now revitalized and has regained beauty. Through PCCCF and its programs, the pavilion will be utilized to its fullest extent. The Philippine Center uses 1200 SF of dedicated space at the upper level and the whole lower level where the Free Medical Clinic is situated. The FMC has 6 Exam Rooms, a Lab, an FMC office and Records Room, a

Dispensary, and areas for medication sorting, registration and triage. The 1100 SF open area in the lower level used as the FMC registration, waiting and triage area will also be used for exercise programs, ballroom and folk dancing, martial arts training, etc., when not in FMC use.

PARKS continues to retain the use of the upper level community room (1500 SF) which they currently rent out to the public. The Philippine Center can also use the Community Room with advance notice, when not rented out by PARKS.

Free Medical Clinic (FMC)

FMC patients now total 2,837, a lot of whom use the FMC as their main source of health care and medication. The assistance of the PMA-W, PNA-WI, UPAAW, Medical College of WI, UWM and Marquette students and other volunteers have sustained the success of the program.

In 2011 alone, 2,347 patients were seen and medical services, medication, laboratory tests and imaging services valued at \$303,382 were given free to the patients. From October, 2000 to May 2012, these free services amounts to \$1, 508,540.

Normal free clinic hours are from 9 AM to 12 Noon every 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month.

Use of the Philippine Center

The Philippine Center is now being fully utilized. Aside from the FMC, meetings of the PCCCF, PMA-W, UPAA-W, and USTAA-W, dance practices for the PMA-W Dinner Dance and the PCCCF cultural night have been held at the Center. The newly formed children choir, the PCCCF "Munting Tinig", has scheduled practices while PNA-WI and the APPA have lined up events at the Center. Schedule for the Consulate on Wheels. and the continuance of the Computer Classes and Tagalog Classes and coming activities will be announced later.

Philippine Independence Day Celebration June 15,16, 2012

Cultural Night, Open House and Picnic: In celebration of the Philippine Independence, the Philippine Center will have a cultural night, dinner and dancing on Friday, June 15 and an open house on Saturday, June 16, 2012 to coincide with the FAAWIS picnic. Park facilities and amenities are reserved for the use of the Filipino American community on these dates.
